POST-SECONDARY COURSES AVAILABLE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF LILLE

PROFESSIONAL TRAINING IN 2 YEARS

Theory combined with apprenticeships in the field. Selective admission.

DUT **LEGAL CAREERS** **D** **A** ALSO ACCESSIBLE AS PARALLEL EMPLOYEE/STUDENT PROGRAMME

This course is designed for a career in practical applications of the law. It includes an end-of-study apprenticeship and a tutored project, enabling students to put into practice what they have learned.

3-YEAR BACHELOR'S DEGREES

Theoretical grounding to prepare for further study up to master's level and/or civil service examinations.

DEGREE **LAW** **B** **A**

The **Law degree** trains students to become legal professionals with a broad understanding of the law, excellent reasoning skills and knowledge of the fundamentals, as well as legal techniques (textual analysis and commentary, analysis of legal documents, etc.). It is also designed to equip students with techniques for written and oral expression needed to apply for category A civil service positions in France.

DEGREE **LAW** **B**

PARCOURS **PANOPTIC LAW** **A**

This course trains students to become legal professionals with a broad understanding of the law, excellent reasoning skills and knowledge of the fundamentals, as well as legal techniques (textual analysis and commentary, analysis of legal documents, etc.).

It is also designed to equip students with techniques for written and oral expression needed to apply for category A civil service positions in France.

DEGREE **LAW**

PARCOURS **INTERNATIONAL & EUROPEAN LAW** **B**

This course provides the essential ground work for studies leading to a career in law or the judiciary, whether in the public or private sector, as well as professions in a European context. It enables students to develop their understanding of European law, master several foreign languages (English and German or Spanish), discover various legal systems within Europe, and develop a capacity for comparative law.

1-YEAR BACHELOR'S DEGREE

DEGREE **PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION** **B**

This course, made available to applicants in year 3, allows students either to sit one or several civil service examinations at the end of the year or to pursue their studies to master's level with a view to attempting examinations at a higher level.

AFTER 2 YEARS OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Whatever your background, you have the option of completing professional training. This course lasts one year and allows you to specialise, obtain a dual qualification or enter the job market after 3 years in higher education. This professional diploma is designed to lead immediately to employment.

OPTION **PANOPTIC LAW**

SUB-OPTION **ESJ LILLE** SELECTIVE ADMISSION **A**

[UNIQUE IN FRANCE]

Course enabling students to take bachelor's degree modules at the University as well as classes at the École Supérieure de Journalisme in Lille (ESJ Lille) with a view to preparing for the entrance examinations at schools of journalism.

DUAL DEGREE **LAW / ART HISTORY** **B** **A**

Opens up career opportunities in both fields. This course is also essential for candidates hoping to sit the examination to qualify as an auctioneer.

The teaching for the dual degree in Law/Art history takes place on site on the Cambrai campus (law coursework) and remotely via the University of Lille (art history coursework).

AFTER A BACHELOR'S DEGREE

You can continue your studies to master's level (5 years in higher education) in fields such as public law, healthcare law, business law, private law, social law, public institutions, political science, digital technology law, public administration, economic and social administration, etc.

You can also sit civil service examinations (teaching, social work, regional authorities) or the entrance examinations for specialist schools (e.g. journalism).
